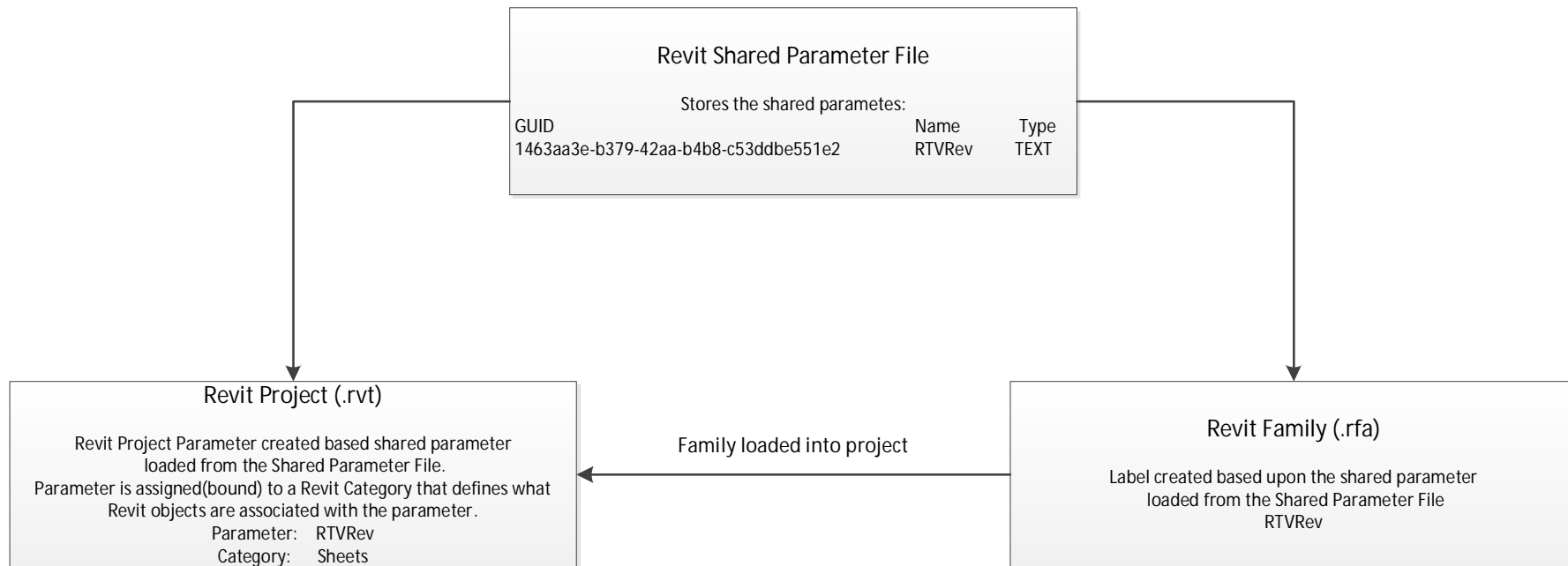


Revit Shared Parameter Workflow



For the shared parameters to function correctly the same shared parameters must be loaded in to both the family file and Revit project.

Each time a shared parameter is created a new unique ID is created (GUID: Global Unique Identifier)

Once a shared parameter has been loaded into a family or project, Revit no longer refers to the Shared Parameter File. The shared parameter's GUID is loaded into and saved with the family and project files.

If the shared parameter workflow has been correctly followed, then when selecting the parameter in the project it will be shown in **Dark Blue**.

If it appears **Light Blue** then the shared parameter GUID is different between the project parameter and shared parameter in the family. This usually occurs when a user has loaded the shared parameter from different shared parameters files. They have the same parameter name but each shared parameter has a different GUID.
